Saturn is the sixth [planet](#) from the [Sun](#) and the second-largest in the [Solar System](#), after [Jupiter](#). It is a [gas giant](#) with an average radius about nine times that of [Earth](#).^{[10][11]} Although only one-eighth the average density of Earth, with its larger volume Saturn is just over 95 times more massive.^{[12][13][14]} Saturn is named after the [Roman god of agriculture](#); its [astronomical symbol](#) (♄) represents the god's [sickle](#).

Saturn's interior is probably composed of a core of [iron–nickel](#) and rock ([silicon](#) and [oxygen](#) compounds). This core is surrounded by a deep layer of [metallic hydrogen](#), an intermediate layer of [liquid hydrogen](#) and [liquid helium](#), and finally outside the [Frenkel line](#) a gaseous outer layer.^[15] Saturn

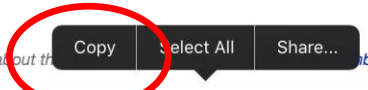
Press and hold your finger on the first word in paragraph "Saturn" till it highlights. Then drag the bottom handle to highlight as much of the paragraph as you want to copy. Choose "Copy" and tap

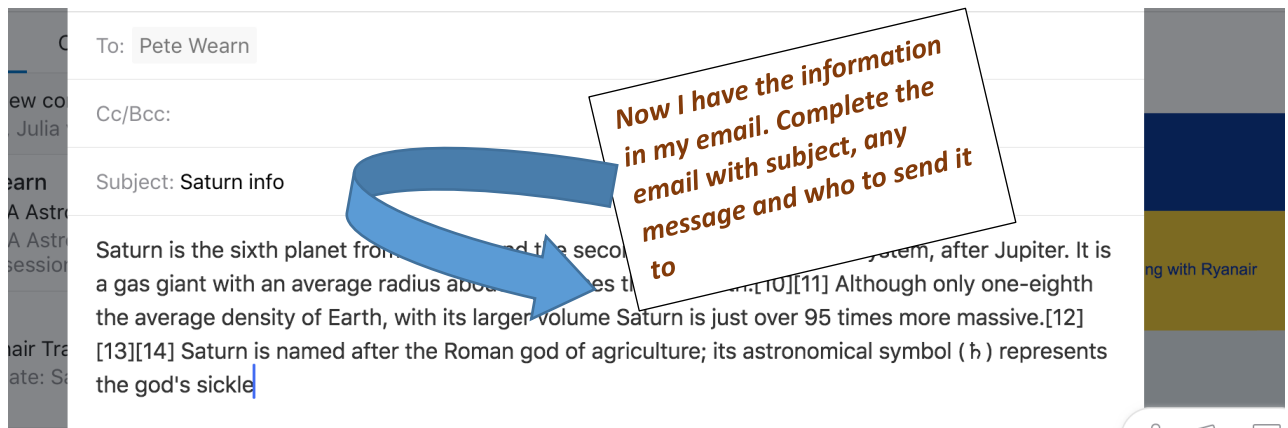
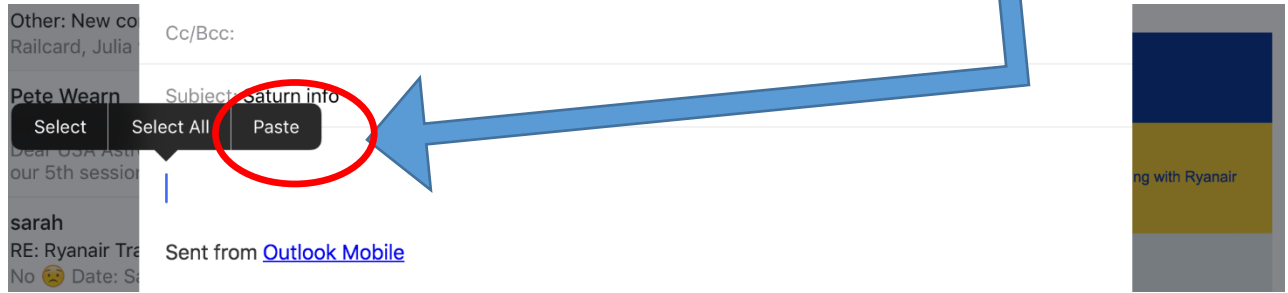
